Call to Order - 8:30 a.m. by Francia Salguero

Opening Prayer - Gregg Reynolds

Introductions were made - (Attendance Sheet attached)

Secretary Report (Carol Lau) – April Meeting Minutes were presented and passed.

Treasurer's Financial Report (Gregg Reynolds) – Presentation as of May 8th, 2018 \$3,497.75. Income in 2018 \$2,059.50. Each voting church should receive an invoice for annual membership dues (balance sheet and bank statement attached).

Overnight Shelter Meals Report (Mary Smith) – Needs Friday, Saturday and Sunday meals for around 60-70 people

Hilda Barg H.P.C. Meals Report (Mary Smith) – May 21 is filled. Needs June 24 and July 1st to July 7th.

SAW Financial Report (David Carr) - Presentation as of April 30th, 2018 \$48,555.53.

Communication Team Report (Ann Albright) - CCOM Brochure: Received old brochures, reduce the number of brochures and the information within each. Discuss goals of brochure. Send events information for Facebook postings. Create a group mailbox for the CCoM Communication Team. The next meeting is June 5th.

Bill Mehr DIC Report (Idris O'Connor) - There is BBQ on June 9th at 11:00 a.m. for clients and churches. Help is needed for set-up at 10 am. The Lions club eye exam is canceled.

Fundraising Committee Report (LaTonya Thomas) – Savers Drop Off is completed. Ask CCoM secretary to send fundraising email in time.

Continuum of Care (COC)- (Jimmy Rogers)

In the 5/10/18 CoC meeting, DSS presented the final Point In Time (PIT) count numbers, with 374 individuals experiencing homelessness in PWC on 1/24/18. This represents a reduction from the 400 counted in January 2017.

The Service Continuum committee, and later the CoC at-large, did not approve the Coordinated Entry System (CES) policies and procedures, so CoC members were asked to abide by the policies as part of a "gentleman's agreement."

The CoC's Community Outreach and Relationship Engagement (CORE) committee is planning on doing a presentation for the CCoM at the 6/9/18 meeting.

The Program Analysis and Ranking (PAR) committee will be reviewing "report cards" from service providers going forward.

The Data and Needs Analysis (DANA) committee wants non-HMIS data for funding applications.

DSS clarified that over 1,100 unique individuals called CES in March and April of 2018. These individuals were "unduplicated" confirmed Tony, meaning that the same individuals could have called "4-5 times" so there may have been more than 2,000 total calls.

DSS was asked about the accuracy of the PIT count, and Tony responded that the demographics were the primary concern, and that the totals could vary based on several factors.

Hilda Barge HPC (Julia Martinez) - Forty clients served, including twenty eight adults and twelve children. None exited to permanent housing.

ACTS (Jeff Foy) - Expanded pantry opens after Memorial Day. Out of rapid rehousing funds, but new funding has come in. Heating assistance season ends in May and cooling assistance season starts in June. Shorter times to get client assistance and access to phone lines have occurred as well. Awareness of coordinated entry number as well.

PWSS (Tony Turnage) - Tony will now attend the CCoM meetings for Courtney.

The stats for **Coordinated Entry System (CES)** are as follows:

Streetlight Ministries - (Rose Powers) June 1st is the annual fund raiser with keynote speaker Mike Kelly. The banquet is seeking \$1000 tables underwritten by churches. The Hope Center is for apt to house medically fragile and ministry also provides tents, propane. They are hopeful to meet 2019 rezoning deadline for tax credits on future Hope Center. Average clients served are forty nightly. They are still looking for meal services on Saturday, Sunday and Monday. Some funds available through June 30th. One client assisted with upcoming surgery, church is providing hotel room for 2-3 weeks while she

recovers from surgery. Human interest story where a client wrote a Thank you card for being helped and letter was read at meeting.
